Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Christmas Dinners

All KS3 free school meal students will automatically be allocated a Christmas dinner. Please note that normal lunch service will be suspended for each year group on their Christmas dinner day. Students across the three year groups, including those who bring in a packed lunch, will all sit together to enjoy the festivities, so that everyone can enjoy the event entertainment and atmosphere as a community.

For our older students in Years 10 and 11 a festive baguette will be available along with a reduced grab and go service, on Thursday 21st December, this does not need to be pre-paid. Our older students will also enjoy some festive fun during their lunch break on Thursday 21st December.

Celebrations

Throughout the week students and staff will take part in end of term celebration assemblies, trips and activities. Students will receive certificates, badges and sweet treats to celebrate a successful first term. The assemblies are integral to our culture and provide a great opportunity for our community to join together in order to celebrate the PRIDE shown by all students this term.



Friday 22nd December is our last day of term and it will be a festive jumper day, students may wear a Christmas jumper or adornments (hats, headbands etc) with their normal school uniform. Lessons will run periods 1, 2 and 3 and students will end the day with their form tutors period 4, with an early finish at 12.30pm. On the last day of term students in Years 7-11 will also be able to enjoy stalls at our Christmas Bazaar where they can exchange £1 for five tokens to 'spend' on games and food at our student-run Christmas Market over the course of the morning. If students would like to spend more money they are very welcome to bring some in to buy extra tokens. All money raised will be donated to charities of our student's choice. Please note, £1 will be paid for all pupil premium and free school meal students.
